

Simon Ojeaga (b. 1996)


Figurative artist from Nigeria whose works are characterized by repetitive, rhythmic lines. These lines breathe life into the bodies and figures that adorn his drawings. His art invites us to engage with an almost hypnotic grace, as we see these lines become the very essence of his creations. Ultimately. he seeks to challenge preconceived notions of beauty and remains inspired by the rich cultural tapestry of the continent.

Ojeaga earned a distinction in Painting from Auchi Polytechnic School of Art and Industrial Design in 2019 and in the same year, he was awarded a 5-week residency by the OYASAF Foundation, established by Prince Yemisi Shyllon. In 2021, he was among the selected artists for the Beyond the Canvas mentorship program with Ndidi Emefiele and in 2022, he was mentored by Ayoola Gbolahan, under a mentorship program organized by AMG Projects.

His first solo showcase, Lines and Wonder, AMG Projects, Lagos (2022) explored various stages of familial interaction, capturing enduring human expressions during challenging circumstances. He also participated in groups shows; Otherwordly, O'Da Art, Lagos (2022), Cadenza, Affinity Gallery, Lagos (2023) and Beyond the Lines, Windsor Gallery, Abidjan(2023).

Nneka Chima (b. 1986)

Nneka employs linocut printmaking as a visual language and storytelling tool. She disovered this medium while studying at Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria, Nigeria and has since mastered the intricate technique, evident in her stylistic consistency and attention to details. Her works merge relaism, surrealism and abstraction to create a sentimental longing and evoke memories often depicted through distorted figures, bold patterns, floral landscapes and vibrant colours.

Her works were first featured a the Moeshen Gallery. Abuja in 2019 then she participated in The No Dead Artists Call, Jonathan Ferrara Gallery, New Orleans (2023), Fluidity, Art Bridge and AMG Projects, Lagos (2023) and Young Contemporary Printmakers, Fresco (2023).

« I draw inspiration from the unexpressed thoughts, feelings, and expressions of people. My art usually features a monochrome palette, although i occasionally incorporate other mediums like gouache and ballpoint pens to further convey my thoughts. My goal is for viewers to reflect and experience a sense of nostalgia, »




Ladunni Lambo (b. 1991)



Amandine Mariama (b. 19xx)

Amandine Mariama is a French self-taught artist based in Lagos. She has been practicing drawing and painting for decades with pencil. ink, printing techniques and oil paint as preferred mediums. Having grown up in different countries, including ten years in francophone West Africa, and having Senegalese origins from her mother's side, her influences are varied. An avid reader, she draws inspiration from books, fiction and childhood stories. She also takes inspiration from the narrative and storytelling produced and disseminated by our globalized and interconnected cultures. She has a multidisciplinary background in literature, history, international relations and urban planning from Université Paris 1 Panthéon Sorbonne, and works for a French organization in Lagos.

Sevi Akinwumi (b. 1988)

Sevi is a Lagos based artist whose work is inspired by tucked-away inner dialogues, expressed right from her late adolescence, which she channels into visual narrative. For this exhibition, Seyi draws from her own experience to inform these body of works; using themes on self awareness, memories and moments spent in solitude. Each drawings bears witness to the present, relating it to personal experiences and incorporating unique line and strokes.

The drawings in the 'Little Red' series comprises of 6 framed black and white sheets with highlights of distinct red, which she recounts as significant moments as a female protagonist, uses sly humor and a bit of ingenuity to turn a familiar tale (The Little Red Ridding Hood) into a feisty feminist tale. Her other work "See Now Unsee" also in series, black and white lose sketches; recount snippets of her present memories, transformed into a form of 'self-life drawing' purposefully deconstructed as a set of stories.

Sevi has exhibited nationally and internationally; Bloom Art Gallery, Lagos (2021), Mydrim Gallery, Lagos (2021), Art for Education. Omolola Coker (b. 1992)

Emerging Nigerian artist whose artwork is a journey through the intricate web of emotions, faith, and self-discovery.

Through the personification of feminine and masculine energies, her canvas is a means to unravel the different psyches of survival. Her female figures depict the vibrancy of nurture and freedom but with a stoicism and careful hopefulness borne of having experienced life. In both, the yearning for wholeness remains.

Coker's artwork is thoughtful, evocative and offers viewers an insider's glimpse into her personal growth, the universal experience of longing and the dynamic changes she observes in her surroundings at large.
