

#### **Exhibition Statement**

#### [EN]

This exhibition invites you to explore intricate sections of art, culture, and storytelling, brought together by artist, Folu Oyefeso. This debut solo exhibition celebrates a dynamic journey spanning fine art, photography, and collaging, unified by a singular focus—uncovering beauty and meaning in everyday life.

At its core, this exhibition reimagines the African aesthetic, presenting signature portraits of Nigeria's culture, history, and people. Through bold digital collages crafted from four years of travel and exploration, Oyefeso weaves narratives of spirituality, architecture, and the individuals who fuel the nation's heartbeat. These works challenge stereotypes and foster a deeper appreciation of Africa's cultural richness.

Each piece immerses viewers in Oyefeso's layered worlds, sparking imagination, and encouraging the renewal of preconceived personal and collective narratives. The Scrapbook is a call for communal awareness, to encourage travel and curiosity to explore, and celebrate the message to become co-creators of a brighter future.

Cette exposition vous invite à explorer des sections complexes d'art, de culture et de narration, réunies par l'artiste Folu Oyefeso. Cette première exposition solo célèbre un parcours dynamique couvrant les beaux-arts, la photographie et le collage, unifié par un objectif singulier : découvrir la beauté et le sens de la vie quotidienne.

Au fond, cette exposition réimagine l'esthétique africaine, en présentant des portraits emblématiques de la culture, de l'histoire et du peuple nigérians. Grâce à d'audacieux collages numériques réalisés au cours de quatre années de voyage et d'exploration, Oyefeso tisse des récits sur la spiritualité, l'architecture et les individus qui font battre le cœur de la nation. Ces œuvres remettent en question les stéréotypes et favorisent une meilleure appréciation de la richesse culturelle de l'Afrique.

Chaque œuvre plonge le spectateur dans les mondes stratifiés d'Oyefeso, suscitant l'imagination et encourageant le renouvellement des récits personnels et collectifs préconçus. The Scrapbook est un appel à la prise de conscience collective, à l'incitation au voyage et à la curiosité pour explorer, et à la célébration du message pour devenir les co-créateurs d'un avenir plus radieux.

# Artist Biography



Folu Oyefeso is a Nigerian photography artist and creative entrepreneur whose work aims to capture the beauty, diversity, and resilience of Nigerian and African people. Through photography and storytelling, Oyefeso challenges stereotypes and assumptions about the continent, and presents a more nuanced and authentic portrayal of the landscape and its people.

Oyefeso's work often focuses on the rich cultural traditions and heritage of Nigeria and West Africa, as well as the daily experiences and challenges of its people. His imagery, articles and videos capture the vibrant energy and spirit, as well as highlight the beauty and diversity of landscapes, cultures, food, architecture and communities.

His efforts since 2020 have resulted in a rich tapestry of experiences which are archived on his personal website - **www.foluoyefeso.com**. This collection of short stories and pictures has grown into an online cultural repository with a steady stream of visitors from all over the world who use it for planning tourist trips, historical research and much more.

Oyefeso's goal is to create a deeper understanding and appreciation of Nigeria and Africa, and inspire viewers to see the continent and its people in its rightfully positive light. He is passionate about improving the tourism landscape and the longevity of small and medium sized businesses, to promote economic growth and wealth building for the continent
